Bordered by Bhutan and the Indian state of Arunachal Pradesh to the north, and Bangladesh and West Bengal to the south, Assam is a stunningly beautiful region renowned for its wildlife. Kaziranga National Park, named 'the Serengeti of India' by National Geographic, along with Nameri and Manas National Parks, teem with diverse wildlife such as tigers, elephants, wild buffalo, and white rhinos.

The Tai-Ahom people, who originated from southern China, established their kingdom in the southeastern Brahmaputra Valley in 1228. They named their new home Mung-Dun-Chun-Kham, meaning 'The Golden Land', which later became known as Assam. Their rule lasted six centuries, until the British arrival in 1826. Today, we can still experience their culture along the riverside villages.



#### Our Riverboat • mv MAHABAAHU

The award-winning **mv Mahabahu** offers a comfortable base for exploring the Brahmaputra and Assam. Largewindowed cabins, half with balconies, provide excellent views of the river and passing villages. Amenities include a dining room with diverse continental and Indian menus, the cozy Soma bar/lounge with daily happy hour, and a sun deck featuring a small pool. The spa offers Ayurvedic therapies, massages, a gym, jacuzzi, and steam room. A small elevator connects most decks. With a maximum capacity of 46 passengers, the attentive crew and serene itinerary ensure a peaceful introduction to India.

The riverboat offers cabins in four categories:

- Cat 1 Superior with double picture windows (195 sq ft)
- Cat 2 Deluxe with private balcony (250 sq ft)
- Cat 3 Luxury with private balcony (280 sq ft)

### **KOLKATA (CALCUTTA)**

On arrival in Kolkata, we transfer directly to our hotel. Kolkata, often described as "The City of Joy", is an alluring microcosm of India. **Taj Bengal Hotel** (2 nights)

### NOV 22, Saturday

KOLKATA

Our first morning provides an overview of this vast city, highlighting the transition from the time of the British Raj to the 21st century. Highlights include Fort William, the Victoria Memorial (1921), the Maidan, and the Raj Bhavan. After lunch, visit Kumartuli, the Potters' Colony, where artisans craft Hindu gods from Hooghly River clay.

### NOV 23, Sunday KOLKATA / JORHAT

Fly to Jorhat and board the mv Mahabaahu. After lunch and a welcome talk, enjoy a sunset cruise followed by our welcome dinner. **mv Mahabaahu** (10 nights)

NOV 24, Monday HOLLONGAPAR SANCTUARY or SIVASAGAR Choose between two excursions today. Hollongapar Gibbon Sanctuary / Jeep Safari: Depart early with a picnic breakfast to explore this sanctuary, home to the hoolock gibbon (the only ape in India) and Bengal slow loris. Enjoy an Assamese brunch and tea experience at a local tea estate, followed by a 3-hour wildlife safari. Sivasagar and the T'Ahom People: Drive through Assamese villages and farmlands to Sivasagar, the region's capital for 600 years. Visit Rang Ghar (royal sports pavilion), Talatal Ghar (an 18th-century palace), and Shiva Dol (India's highest Shiva temple).

### NOV 25, Tuesday MAJULI and NEAMATI GHAT

Walk the Neamati Ghat to experience the waking village, then enjoy breakfast as we sail to Majuli, the world's largest river island. Experience the Neo-Vaishnav people's dances and music, including Gayan Bayan, Dashavatar, and Mukha Bhavana. Majuli is renowned for its mask-making and pottery and is home to unique fauna like open-billed storks, whistling ducks, bar-headed geese, and weaver birds. Enjoy free time to explore the local bazaar. In the evening, enjoy a bush BBQ on a deserted island.

NOV 26, Wednesday MISHING VILLAGE and SAFARI In Mishing, visit private homes (Chang Ghars) to observe daily life and traditional weaving. The Mishings wear traditional attire: dhoti kurta for men and mekhla chaadar for women. After lunch, use the ship's tenders to explore the national park shores, watching for water buffalo, elephants, various birds, and water monitors. Back on board, enjoy a cooking demonstration by the chef.

### NOV 27, Thursday BISHWANATH GHAT

Explore Bishwanath, where weavers, fishermen, farmers, and boatmakers thrive. Visit the ancient Shiva Dol temple by the riverbank, surrounded by traditional fishing boats. Then, visit Silghat to witness the jute processing at the Jute Mill, from golden fibre to gunny bags. Nearby, observe women harvesting tea leaves at a tea estate. Conclude with a performance of Assam's State Dance, 'Bihu', performed by local children.

### NOV 28, Friday KAZIRANGA NATIONAL PARK

Today, choose between two thrilling adventures, both offering opportunities to spot Asiatic elephants, wild cats, water buffalo, deer, and the famous one-horned rhinoceros up close and personal in this UNESCO World Heritage

Site. Elephant Ride / Jeep Safari: Begin early with a thrilling elephant ride at sunrise. After, enjoy breakfast with Indian specialties like dosas (thin savoury crepes), idlis (rice cakes), poori aloo (potato curry with crisp fried bread), and parathas (flatbread). Then, embark on two jeep safaris exploring the Central and Western Ranges, with lunch. Jeep Safari at Eastern & Central Range: Opt for a full-day jeep safari through the Eastern and Central Ranges, including lunch. Return to our riverboat, passing through the scenic paddy fields of the Karbi Anglong people.

### NOV 29, Saturday NAMERI NP OR KAZIRANGA NP

Today offers two enticing options. Nameri National Park: Begin early with a drive to Nameri, renowned for its diverse wildlife including the Bengal tiger. Join our naturalist guide for a 2-hour park walk followed by a leisurely 2-hour boat

float along the scenic Jia-Bhaireli River. Kaziranga National Park: Opt for a 3-hour jeep safari to the Western Range of Kaziranga NP. Both groups return to the ship for lunch and an afternoon of cruising. In the evening, we are in for a special treat, the Assamese theme evening. Dress in traditional attire and indulge in local snacks, traditional dances, music, and a themed dinner.

CRUISING THE BRAHMAPUTRA NOV 30. Sunday Spend a leisurely day cruising down the Brahmaputra River. Relax by the pool or indulge in spa services aboard our riverboat. Enjoy views of villages, farms, and the majestic Himalayas as we pass Peacock Island, the world's smallest inhabited river island.

MANAS NP / TIGER RESERVE DEC 1, Monday Today, we journey north to Manas National Park for a safari in the Bansbari Range. Located at the Bhutan border, the park features hills leading to mountains. Spend the morning searching for Bengal tigers, golden langurs, and diverse wildlife. Enjoy lunch at a park resort and return to our

riverboat for an afternoon cruise.

DEC 2, Tuesday **SUALKUCHI** In Sualkuchi, enjoy a special welcome show of Bodo dances by tribal folk. Explore the village by e-rickshaw, discovering the art of silk making and weaving. After an authentic Assamese lunch, indulge in some retail therapy. In the evening, savour our final sunset cruise followed by

DEC 3, Wednesday **GUWAHATI / KOLKATA** Later this morning, we bid fond farewells to our wonderful staff and floating home before catching a short flight to Kolkata. Taj Bengal Hotel (2 nights)

DEC 4, Thursday **KOLKATA** Visit Asia's largest flower market, a dazzling array of

colours and people. Stop by Mother Teresa's Missionaries of Charity to learn about their ongoing work. At the Indian Museum (established in 1814 as the Imperial Museum), explore exhibits dedicated to the British Raj.

DEC 5, Friday **KOLKATA / CANADA** Enjoy your final day at leisure. Relax by the pool or explore the city centre. We fly home this evening. BL

**DEC 6, Saturday CANADA** Arriving in Toronto this morning, we make connections to

our homes across Canada.

Alternative excursions are available for those with limitations. Off-boat excursions may encounter rough roads, limited facilities, and conditions typical of a developing country. We are visiting during the dry winter season and temperatures will range from cool evenings to hot days. Members must be ready to experience the reality that is remote India.

**Note:** River cruising in India is an adventurous experience. Assam's tourism infrastructure is being developed to meet growing interest. Our expedition-style cruise ensures onboard satisfaction. Shore-side staff will prioritize your comfort during expeditions. While we use the best equipment available, expect varying vehicle and road standards. Wildlife sightings are not guaranteed. Please note that this itinerary is subject to weather and river conditions, and may be adjusted for your safety and comfort by the Captain/Cruise Director. The Brahmaputra River experiences seasonal changes, with islands and sand bars appearing and disappearing between sailings.
