## Our Cruise Ship • ms Amadeus Riva

The **AMADEUS Riva**, built in 2023, brings a new generation of luxury cruising, showcasing innovative and green designs that focus on sustainability, renewal, and well-being. You'll find plenty of room to roam, from the River Terrace bar to the generous Sun Deck.

With 67 cabins (16m²) and 12 suites (26.4m²), the ms Amadeus Riva will carry passengers in spacious comfort. Purpose-built to sail the safe scenic waters of Europe's rivers, it has three decks with cabins and public rooms, plus a spacious Sun Deck for viewing the countryside.

All cabins are outside, each featuring either double or twin-sized beds, a private bathroom with a shower, telephone, TV, in-room safe, and individual climate control. Cabins on Haydn Deck (the lowest deck) have a picture window while cabins on Strauss and Mozart Decks have drop-down panoramic windows, and suites have a walk-out exterior balcony. On the Haydn Deck, you will also find a massage area and fitness room.

On the Strauss Deck, you'll discover the Restaurant and onboard shop. Moving up to the Mozart Deck, you'll encounter the Panorama Bar, Reception, River Terrace, Café Vienna, and the Amadeus Club. Out on the open Sun Deck, guests can enjoy deck chairs, chessboards, and a shuffleboard. The ship is a non-smoking environment, except for some designated areas (subject to change). Additionally, there is a small elevator onboard serving the Strauss, Mozart, and Haydn Decks.

## APR 6, Monday AMSTERDAM, NETHERLANDS

On arrival, we are transferred to the ship to settle in before gathering for a Welcome Cocktail reception followed by a special Welcome Dinner with a traditional Shanty Choir performance.

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## APR 7, Tuesday ARNHEM

Drive through the historic streets of Arnhem, where the dramatic events of Operation Market Garden unfolded during World War II. This military operation aimed to secure key bridges in the Netherlands, but the intense battle for Arnhem Bridge ended in German control, marking a major setback for the Allies. Explore the Airborne Museum in Oosterbeek, located in Hartenstein, a former hotel that became the headquarters of the British 1st Airborne Division under Major General Roy Urquhart during the battle. The museum offers powerful exhibits on this historic event and was awarded the prestigious 2009 Golden Heron Award for its innovative use of spatial media. afternoon, visit the Kröller-Müller Museum, home to the world's second-largest collection of Van Gogh paintings and drawings. The museum also features works by Piet Mondrian, Paul Gauguin, Pablo Picasso, and Claude Monet. As evening falls, our enchanting cruise continues toward Middelburg.

## APR 8, Wednesday MIDDELBURG, BELGIUM

In Middelburg, known for its 1,100 large and small monuments, we'll explore historic merchant houses and canal-side storefronts, once thriving hubs of the Dutch East India Company in the 17th century. Our guided walking tour will showcase the Abbey, the impressive town hall, and old warehouses and monuments. We also have the opportunity to visit Veere, a bustling trading port during the Middle Ages, famed for its wool trade with Scotland. Here, we'll wander the charming streets, pass by the Gothic Grote Kerk cultural centre, and end our visit with a tasting of traditional Dutch specialties such as bitterballen or Zeeuwse oysters, complemented by fine wine.

### APR 9, Thursday GHENT / BRUGES

In Ghent, we discover a city that seamlessly blends its medieval legacy with modernity. Its city centre proudly showcases Flemish heritage at every turn. Our guided tour highlights key landmarks, including St. Bavo's Cathedral, home to the renowned Jan van Eyck triptych altar, Gravensteen Fortress, and the UNESCO-listed Ghent Belfry with its 54 ringing bells. Enjoy some free time to explore the area on your own. Later, we journey to Bruges, often hailed as the "Venice of the North" for its intricate canal network. This romantic city, steeped in medieval charm, invites us to wander its labyrinth of cobblestone streets and canals. Bruges was known as a commercial metropolis in the heart of Europe. Don't miss the historic marketplace, the Burg (site of the former Bruges castle), and the Basilica of the Holy Blood, all nestled within the charming UNESCO-listed historic centre. BLD

#### APR 10. Friday ANTWERP / BRUSSELS

Today, we're welcomed to Antwerp, Belgium's secondlargest city. Our morning begins with a captivating tour of Brussels, the nation's capital. Explore the lush Laeken area, featuring highlights like the Church of Our Lady of

Laeken and the famous Atomium. Then, we drive past scenic boulevards to Cinquantenaire Park, where we'll admire the royal palace and conclude our visit at Europe's oldest shopping mall, with some free time to explore. Then, we venture to Antwerp, one of Europe's most historic ports. We'll visit the impressive Cathedral of Our Lady, Belgium's largest Gothic church, and we'll take a stroll through the charming old town centre, perhaps indulging at a Belgian waffle stand before enjoying free time at your leisure. ## APR 11, Saturday ROTTERDAM, NETHERLANDS

Journey to Kinderdijk, home to the largest collection of 18th -century windmills. Originally built to drain water from the soil, windmills are now UNESCO-protected and a renowned tourist attraction. Visit an old mill to explore its history and see how technology has shaped its operation through the years. Following lunch, we immerse ourselves in the renowned Keukenhof Gardens. Spanning over 79 acres, it boasts a stunning display of 7 million tulips, narcissi, and hyacinths, complemented by tranquil ponds, vibrant sculpture gardens and lush greenhouses. Conclude the day with a special Captain's Gala Dinner.

## APR 12, Sunday AMSTERDAM

Embark on a morning tour and scenic canal cruise to uncover the rich history of Amsterdam. With approximately 7,500 registered historic buildings and 90 islands connected by over 1,000 bridges, our exploration will unveil the city's most notable landmarks, including the captivating Museum Quarter and the majestic Royal Palace. Continuing our adventure, we journey to the picturesque fishing village of Volendam, where we'll leisurely walk through its charming streets. A visit to a local cheese factory will provide us with fascinating insights into the cheese-making process. Lastly, we'll wander through the idyllic village of Edam, soaking in its timeless charm.
